

## Ironwood, Eastern Hop Hornbeam

Ostrya virginiana Fabaceae

## **Description**

The wood of this tree is one of the toughest woods of North America, hence the name Ironwood. It's used for making tool handles, mallets, and fence posts. Its other nickname, Eastern Hop Hornbeam, is due to the fact that its fruits are very similar to that of the hops plant. The fruit consists of small papery sacks that contain tiny, flattened nuts. This allows the seeds to be more easily dispersed by the wind.
