

Purple Robe Black Locust Robina pseudoacacia 'Purple Robe' Fabaceae

Description

The Purple Robe Black Locust is a beautiful, fragrant spring bloomer with delicate, lacey foliage in the summer. Black seed pods hang from it in the fall, and as they dry, will rattle in the wind. Like the Honeylocust, Black Locusts have sharp thorns on them, especially on their suckers, though they are much smaller. However, unlike the Honeylocust, the seeds and pods are toxic.
