

Bur Oak Quercus macrocarpa Fagaceae

Description

Found in the North Dakota Oak Savannas, Bur Oaks can live to be 400 years old! They produce large nuts or seeds leading to the second part of their scientific name: macro(large)-carpa(fruit). It produces acorns every 2-3 years in groups of 2-3.
