

Ivory Silk Japanese Tree Lilac Syringa reticulata 'Ivory Silk' Oleaceae

Description

Ivory Silk is a unique cultivar of the Japanese Tree Lilac. Its white panicles of fragrant spring flowers have a coarser appearance, more like the common lilac shrub. It also has a more rounded, oval shape than the classic pyramidal shape of the Japanese Tree Lilac.
