

Eastern White Pine Pinus strobus Pinaceae

The Eastern White Pine can live to be more than 350 years old and can reach heights of over 180 feet. It's native to the Eastetn United States through Eastern Iowa. It produces large amounts of pollen in the spring, contributing to seasonal allergies.
