

Dolgo Crabapple Malus baccata 'Dolgo' Rosaceae

Description

The Dolgo Crabapple is a beautiful ornamental tree, but is grown mostly for its fruit. It has a tart and slightly spicy flavor that lends itself well to cider, jams, syrups, and even fresh eating. If fruit is not harvested, it will stay on the tree through fall and into winter unless consumed by birds and small mammals who eat it readily.
