

## **Radiant Flowering Crabapple**

Malus 'Radiant'
Rosaceae

## **Description**

Radiant Flowering Crabapple is a beautiful ornamental specimen that blooms a fragrant, rosy pink in the spring followed by green foliage in the summer. Red fruit develops in the late summer-fall and will stay on throughout the winter months. Fruits are edible, though tart, and can be used to make jellies, jams, and ciders.
