

## **Red Barron Crabapple**

Malus 'Red Barron'
Rosaceae

## **Description**

Red Barron Crabapple is a beautiful ornamental specimen that blooms a fragrant, rosy pink in the spring followed by bronze foliage in the summer. Bright red fruits develop in the late summer-fall and will stay on throughout the winter months. Fruits are edible, though tart, and can be used to make jellies, jams, and ciders.
