



Snowdrift Crabapple

Malus 'Snowdrift'

Description

Snow Drift Crabapple is a beautiful ornamental specimen that blooms a fragrant, white in the spring followed by deep green foliage in the summer. Bright red fruits develop in the late summer-fall and will stay on throughout the winter months. Fruits are edible, though tart, and can be used to make jellies, jams, and ciders.
