

Canada Red Chokecherry
Prunus virginiana 'Canada Red'

Description

People usually have a love-hate relationship with Canada Red Chokecherries. These native trees produce masses of fragrant white flowers in the spring. Then, their green foliage quickly turns into a deep purple throughout the summer followed by an orange fall canopy. Despite the preceeding qualities, it can be strongly disliked due to its suckering habit and invasive qualities. Birds will also eat the berries and spread them throughout yards and garden beds.
