Description

The Korean Sun Pear is, as its name suggests, native to Korea. It's a great specimen tree for small yards, beds. In the spring it's covered in white, fragrant flowers. The green, summer foliage turns a beautiful flame red in the fall. Small, inedible pear-like fruits develop in the fall as well and provide food for birds and other small mammals throughout the winter months.
