

Blue Beech, Musclewood, American Hornbeam Carpinus caroliniana Salicaceae

Description

The Blue Beech is also called Musclewood due to the appearance of muscles on its trunk and branches. It's one of the few trees hardy to North Dakota that can survive in full shade. It turns a brilliant yellow, orange, red in the fall.
