

Silver Maple Acer saccharinum Sapindaceae

Description

It has the softest wood used for lumber, hence it also being called "Soft Maple." It's more adaptable to alkaline environments than the sugar maple, though would still prefer an acidic soil. Seeds are edible once roasted or boiled and syrup can be made from the sap of the tree.
